IX:C CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE - KNIGHTSBRIGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SITE

Ms. Karen Collins, Director of Planning Services, spoke regarding the request for approval of the Contract for Purchase and Sale with Hank Sabeti. The contract is for the acquisition of 19 +/- acres of real property for a future elementary school. The property is located east of Poinciana Boulevard and north of 17-92 and may potentially provide relief to Sunrise Elementary, Kissimmee Elementary, and Central Avenue Elementary.

Staff obtained two appraisals for this property in October, 2006, which valued this property at \$1,710,000 and \$2,565,000 with the assumption that Commercial is the highest and best use of the property. Staff reviewed the appraisals with the developer and the developer commissioned a re-appraisal of the site with the assumption that a portion of their multi-family entitlements could be transferred onto this site since it would be an eligible use under a commercial zoning district. The updated appraisal report valued the property at \$3,925,000 . The developer has agreed to the following:

Purchase Price	=	\$3,800,000.00 (@ \$200,000 per acre)
Cash Payment	=	\$2,850,000.00
Impact Fee Credits	=	\$ 950,000.00

Mr. Tanner Roe spoke regarding this issue. He stated that Planning Services staff and consultants have completed an extensive search for available real estate within this corridor attempting to locate alternative elementary school sites. Their conclusion is that this is the best available site and is in proximity to the area of critical need, resolving the need for an elementary school.

Attorney D'Agresta stated, from a procedural basis, this contract will require an extraordinary vote of the Board which is going to be at least four votes in favor.

Following a discussion, Mr. Stone moved to approve a 90 day due diligence period for this property. Seconded by Mr. Wheeler.

Attorney D'Agresta stated this document is currently a purchase agreement, but they would revise it to reflect the 90 day due diligence period.

Attorney D'Agresta stated the second part of this issue is with design deficiencies. District staff believe there area specific design deficiencies at Celebration High School attributable to Schenkel Shultz Architecture. She spoke regarding a call she received from counsel for Schenkel Shultz Architecture advising they would be willing to sign a tolling agreement which would toll the statute of limitations with regard to two specific areas: 1) a mis-specification of an underground pipe in the courtyard at Celebration High School and 2) a drainage problem with the ball fields at Celebration High School.

Mr. Houston spoke regarding this issue.

Mr. Joseph Tothe, Principal with Schenkel Shultz Architecture, spoke regarding this issue. He stated they know about the issue with the courtyard and ball fields and they are not trying to limit this to a pipe in the ground, but their concern was with the agreement being wide open and they were just trying to identify the issues at hand so they can continue to work diligently to address those issues.

Attorney D'Agresta spoke regarding a memo that was prepared by Mr. Houston's department which summarized what they believe to be the issues and she would be comfortable with attaching that memo to the tolling agreement.

Mr. Tothe stated they are committed to signing the tolling agreement based on what the school district feels is required to be corrected at the school.

Attorney D'Agresta recommended they move forward if Mr. Houston could look at the memo first thing tomorrow morning and confirm those are the outstanding issues, and we have a signed document from Schenkel Shultz Architecture before lunch tomorrow

Mr. Houston suggested they use the tolling agreement similar to the one signed by Balfour Beatty Construction Company and under the tolling provision add language stating, "intentionally toll all statute of limitations with regard to the project site drainage and field drainage."

Attorney D'Agresta and Mr. Tothe indicated they were in agreement with that language if that was the scope.

Superintendent Muse recommended approval of the negotiated agreement between the City of Kissimmee and the School Board. The agreement provides for the use of an alternative school for a period of five (5) years as was discussed with the City of Kissimmee Council.

Mr. Stone moved to approve the recommendation. Seconded by Mr. Wheeler.

Attorney D'Agresta spoke regarding a comment that was made during the City of Kissimmee's meeting about the School Board following the process for rezoning as every other developer does by submitting the application, paying the fee, and moving through the process. She spoke regarding her discussion with Mr. Don Smallwood, Counsel for the City of Kissimmee, regarding the statutes governing School Boards and fees we are exempt from and his response to her letter indicating the City is standing firm that the school district must pay the approximately \$700 fee for rezoning.

Mr. Greer disagreed with paying the \$700 fee for rezoning. He stated the school district is charged by the State to spend the money they receive for the enhancement of education for students. He stated the school district paid the City of Kissimmee approximately \$125,000 last year to collect our impact fees at 1.5% of what they collected and they should now only be charging us the actual cost of collection. He would like to find out what the actual cost of collection is before they pay them any money.

Mr. Wheeler stated the issue with the Sports Authority building has gone on for a very long time and even though it does not seem right for them to pay the \$700 fee, they need to do what it takes to get this project moving as quickly as possible.

Attorney D'Agresta stated the school district could pay the fee under protest and include in the letter that we intend to seek a declaratory judgment action or further direction from a court regarding whether a School Board has the obligation to pay such a fee.

Mr. Ken Baker, SchoolField Properties, indicated that, as the owner of the property, they would be willing to pay the fee in order to keep this project moving forward quickly.
