## **Fall Academic Sport Champions Named**

The Osceola County School Board has named its 2010/2011 Team Osceola Academic Champions for the Fall sports of cross country, football, golf, swimming/diving, and volleyball. This award recognizes student athletes for performance in the classroom, as well as in the athletic arena.

Boys Cross Country - **St. Cloud High School** -- 3.484 GPA

*St. Cloud High School finished seventh in the state in Boys Cross Country 3A*

Girls Cross Country - **New Dimensions High School** -- 3.522 GPA

*New Dimensions High School finished thirteenth in the state in Girls Cross Country 2A*

Football - **Celebration High School** -- 3.052 GPA

*Celebration High School finished fourth in the state Football 3A*

Boys Golf - **Gateway High School** -- 3.755 GPA

*Gateway High School finished third in the state in Boys Golf 2A*

Girls Golf - **Celebration High School** -- 3.478 GPA

*Celebration High School finished ninth in the state in Girls Golf 2A*

Boys Swimming/Diving - **Osceola High School** -- 3.443 GPA

*Osceola High School finished second in the state in Boys Swimming/Diving 3A*

*Gateway High School finished sixth in the state in Boys Swimming/Diving 3A*

Girls Swimming/Diving - **Osceola High School** -- 3.519 GPA

*Osceola High School finished third in the state in Girls Swimming/Diving 3A*

*Gateway High School finished fifth in the state in Girls Swimming/Diving 3A*

Volleyball - **St. Cloud High School** -- 3.452 GPA

*St. Cloud High School finished ninth in the state in Volleyball 4A*

Overall for all Fall sports combined, Gateway High School finished fourth in the state in 6A, and Osceola High School finished sixth in the state in 5A. Points were given according to where a school places in each of the categories. The top 10 schools in each category received points. Points awarded for teams in single-class sports counted towards the overall standings.

Each season, the team earning the highest grade point average in each sport from Osceola's eight comprehensive high schools is presented a certificate at a School Board meeting. The grades of the student athletes are submitted each season to the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA), and top schools in the state are also recognized by the FHSAA.

"I am proud to recognize these student athletes for their teamwork not only in competition, but in the classroom as well," said Superintendent Dr. Michael A. Grego. "Their success both on and off the playing field speaks to the high standards we have set for our students and the motivation they have to achieve."
